Ready for Replanting, KUD Sawit Subur Signed the MoU with BRI, BPDPKS and Asian Agri

Musi Banyuasin, 16 October 2017 – Asian Agri, one of the leading private companies in Indonesia, signed an MoU with cooperative KUD Sawit Subur, bank BRI and government body BPDPKS (Indonesian Oil Palm Estate Fund Agency) for a smallholder oil palm replanting program at Musi Banyuasin, South Sumatera last Friday.
